Join us around the fire pits and beautifully lit trees of Barangaroo Reserve's Walumil Lawn for a soulful evening of music and vibes at NAIDOC Up Late.

ARIA nominated singer-songwriter and eclectic musical icon [Mo'ju](#) will headline the night with an exciting set of restorative jams. With three releases under their belt – *Native Tongue* (2018), *Ghost Town* (2019), and *O.K.* (2021) – this cult indie artist is as prolific in the recording studio as on the touring circuit. In 18 months, Mo'ju batched 200 shows on three continents, including national tour supports for both The Hilltop Hoods and Paul Kelly, festival dates at WOMAD and SXSW, and two headline tours that included dates at Sydney Opera House and Melbourne Arts Centre.

Themed Get Up, Stand Up, Show Up, the fair will feature artworks from remote Indigenous art centres and artists as well as stalls that regularly appear at the ever-popular Blak Markets. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander creatives are travelling from the far corners of Australia – places like Ceduna, Haasts Bluff, the Tiwi Islands and Yuendumu – presenting a rare and exciting opportunity for Sydneysiders to interact directly with the makers.

9 July (\$18-\$35): Dharawal Guided Indigenous Trail Walk

Dharawal National Park - End of Victoria Road, Wedderburn

Join this unique tour and discover the [Dharawal National Park](#) from a Koori perspective. Guided by your Aboriginal Discovery Rangers, listen to their stories, learn about the bush and the environment and start to feel connected to people and country. Later, enjoy the experience of traditional making methods of women and men, by taking part in an activity.

For cultural reasons, it has been requested from the local Land Council that adult men abstain from the site of Minerva Pool. With this request, NSW National Parks and Wildlife have changed the itinerary slightly on this walk. Men are welcome to join this walk but will be split from the women about halfway along the trail. The women will take the trail down to Minerva Pool escarpment to take part in an activity with a female Discovery Guide. The men will continue on the trail with a male Discovery Guide to a site with a small waterfall and creek. This site is a significant meeting place for Dharawal men with a connection to Minerva Pool. The women and men will regroup after the activities to continue back up the trail
